Please follow these guidelines and focus on capturing moments applying the the principles of composition learned in class.

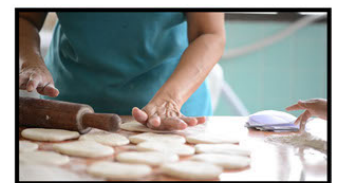
a) Type the essay's title and date it was photographed:

b) Write a small paragraph (3 to 5 lines of text) of the activity you photographed.

c) You DON'T need to post the camera settings below the photo **as you'll be using your cell phone** for this assignment. **You won't be required to retouch the images**, simply post them on your Spark Page straight out of your camera.

d) Using the grid feature on Spark **post your photo essays as indicated above and list the principles of composition you used to create the essay.**



Guiding Lines - Framing - Rule of thirds

Your first photo essay is due on Friday, March 27, 2020. The second photo essay is due on Friday, April 3, 2020. Each essay is 10 points if completed using the guidelines above (every photo is 1 point)
